Our mission is to provide the training, tools and informational resources communities need to hold prison profiteers (particularly corporations that finance the private prison industry) accountable for their actions.



In September 1999, led by Prison Moratorium Project and Grassroots Leadership, Not With Our Money! took on multinational corporation, Sodexho Alliance, demanding that the catering company divest its 10% stake in Corrections Corporation of America (CCA). By the end of June 2001, CCA's largest shareholder had ended all ties with the prison company as a result of protests at more than 60 campuses where subsidiary Sodexho Marriott Services held contracts.

DUMP FARALLON CAMPAIGN

Not With Our Money! has launched a new campaign directed at Farallon Capital Management, LLC, the fourth largest hedge fund in the world, with about \$9.86 billion dollars of assets under management.

Farallon invests over \$70 million in the Corrections Corporation of America making it one of the largest institutional investors in the largest private prison company in the world. Farallon currently holds 4.5% of the shares in CCA. CCA is the oldest, largest, and most notorious of the private prison companies. According to CCA's website, the company operates over 50% of the private prison beds in the country.

What YOU can do on your Campus:

- 1) Send a letter to your university administrator to get more information on your specific universities connection to Farallon and Corrections Corporation of America.
- 2) Start a petition with signatures from students, faculty, staff and alumni.
- 3) Write a letter to the editor or an editorial for you campus newspaper.
- 4) Hold a teach-in or film screening to raise awareness about prison issues on your campus.
- 5) Hold a press conference to bring more media attention to the issue during the Week of Action
- 6) Organize an action against Farallon and CCA. Demand a socially responsible investment policy from your university.
